PRESIDENT'S REPORT

In recent times we have been involved in various presentations, meetings and conferences. Sharon and I attended the launch of Yellow Ribbon week at the Opera House. Great to meet up with both the new Ministers for Transport in the NSW Government, The Hon. Andrew Constance MP, Minister for Transport and The Hon. Paul Toole MP, Minister for Regional Transport.



Both spoke well in the presentation for the Yellow Ribbon event—they seem fairly passionate about trying their best to slow down traffic trauma.

Moves for Transport for NSW to get to zero road deaths is a difficult proposition but things are headed in the right direction. Road deaths per capita are well below the levels of the bad old days in the 70s. No such things as ABS, airbags and many other innovations back 40 years ago. Vehicle safety and roads have improved out of sight since then but driver attitudes need to come a long way yet. Big issue is the use of mobile devices when driving. Why do people do such things when hands free stuff is freely available? People actually text on their phones when driving, the Police report. What sort of mentality is that folks ?? They actually class it as an addiction.

Minister Toole accepted my invitation to attend Shannons Sydney Classic (SSC) on Sunday 18th August. We look forward to hosting him and showing him the extent of our movement.

Most interesting to us all is the fact that a full review of both HVS and CVS is underway within RMS. We attended a meeting at RMS Parramatta where ACMC had six representatives and CHMC (Bush Council) also had six. Many subjects were covered on the day and further meetings are planned. No great plans to make any major changes to either scheme as far as we heard.

A major concern is the somewhat unruly ways that any old club can apply to join the RMS Approved list for HVS. No proper checks are in place. In some other states, clubs MUST be a member of their state council such as the CMC or ACMC but not in NSW for some reason not fully explained. Reason for the change to original forms for HVS and CVS was explained as some people keeping last year's Declaration Form and using a copy to re-register. Not bothering to stay in their club and not asking for the club's stamp each year. Illegal in both cases. Always problem people trying to rort the system and foul it up for all of us.

Also involved in organizing a group of our club members to join in focus groups to talk through the logbook trial with a view to making it permanent by October this year. A great group of delegates at the most recent CMC General Meeting came forward and volunteered. Many thanks to those folks for your help and commitment. Main message we need to get across is that the vast majority of our members love the logbook scheme and want it to continue. A better quality version of the logbook would be good as the piece of A4 paper is not a good look. Particularly for motorcycle riders. Where do you store it on a wet day?

I look forward to catching up with as many of you as possible at SSC on August 17 and 18. If you have some time to volunteer on the Saturday to help us set up that would be appreciated. Folks to guide the incoming vehicles into their positions on Sunday morning are also in great demand. Just an hour or so of your time would make a fantastic difference to us. Please come down to the CMC garages 49 and 50 on the day to talk with all of the CMC Committee on hand.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

At registration renewal time you must follow the process of filling in the left side of an RMS #1835 Classic Vehicle Declaration form, have your Club Registrar apply the Primary Club stamp to the lower right hand box then post to the address below, with a copy of the Pink Slip and the \$25 administration fee. The form must be an original as per instructions from RMS. See dot point 1 at the top of the form. The fee is \$30 if you are using post as we are insisting on Express Post return at \$5 extra which is less than the cost of such envelopes, but we are subsidizing it trying to overcome a rash of lost mail. It gives us a trace on the mail and gets swift delivery. Multiple CVS in the one envelope will be just one \$5 fee, not \$5 each one.

FOR CLUB REGISTRARS

HOW TO HANDLE CLASSIC VEHICLE SCHEME (CVS) APPLICATIONS

The Applicant should fill in sections 1 and 2 of the Classic Vehicle Declaration (RMS #1835). Please do not fill in or sign Section 3 of that form. This is for the ACMC to fill in and sign as we are the Approved Organization and the Authorized Person.

The Primary club (i.e. your club) should simply stamp the lower right-hand box to signify that the applicant is a bona fide member of your Club and his or her vehicle is acceptable to your Club.

Without that stamp we will not process the application. The stamp should be legible for all to read as RMS are very strict on such things.

RMS insist that to start off CVS an AUVIS or Blue Slip must be obtained for the vehicle no matter what rego it is currently on. Not our rule, it comes from RMS. Not all AIS can do these.

If any of your fellow Club Members wish to register their vehicles on the CVS would you please ask them **NOT to send us the original Blue Slip.** A photocopy is sufficient. If they go astray in the mail they would need to go through the whole process and cost of obtaining one again. Note also that they only last for 42 days so it requires prompt use of them.

All we need is the Classic Vehicle Declaration, a copy of the Blue Slip and a cheque, money order, or EFT receipt when they send these documents by post to ACMC PO Box 419 Bexley 2207.

The fee is \$25 for the processing and we now ask for an extra \$5 to cover Express Post return as there has been a spate of lost mail and the Express system gives us a number to trace the item plus a guarantee of next day delivery in most cases. **So the total payable is \$30**. Multiple CVS in the one envelope will only incur a \$5 fee for the post so \$25 a car plus \$5.

Please then follow the payment details on the previous page for either cheque/money order or EFT.



The Sydney Antique Machinery Club extends an invitation to members of your club to display at our annual "Clarendon Classic" Rally on 21st and 22nd September. The event is being held at the Hawkesbury Showground, Racecourse Road, Clarendon, opposite the Richmond RAAF Base. Setup is on Friday 20th.

The event will feature all kinds of antique and vintage machinery including stationary engines, tractors, trucks, cars, motorcycles, boats, steam power, and model and hobby displays. We are again co-hosting the "Kenworth Klassic" truck display of historic and working Kenworth trucks.

Criteria for Celebration of Anniversaries at the Shannons Sydney Classic

Celebrations should recognise Anniversaries of Clubs:

5 years for first time anniversary, then in 10-year intervals. i.e.10, 20, 30 etc.

Major motoring events & vehicle models in time intervals of 10 years or multiples thereof.

Celebration of an event should only be for major milestones such as:

- * 1st Australian GP
- * 1st Redex trial or Round Australia Trial
- * Opening of 1st Holden body works
- * 1st Sydney to Melbourne journey by car

Vehicle model anniversaries to include:-

- Release of a new model name (excluding a series no. such as "XJ6 series 3", "First Mustang but not the fourth version")
- Release of a model upgrade which includes a significant body remodelling or design (Spitfire 4 or MGB GT may qualify)
- Release of a significant and innovative technological upgrade (Skyline GTR would qualify as distinct from early variations to the original Datsun Skyline)
- Release of a model variation which had a major impact on Australian motoring events or history (Ford Falcon GT or Mini Cooper S would fall under this category).


