The event will be conducted under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia., the Speed Event Standing Regulations, The Motorsport Australia Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) Policy the Motorsport Australia Come and Try Policy, these Supplementary Regulations and any further Supplementary Regulations or Bulletins which may be issued. This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1<sup>st</sup> and Risk Management Policies. This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with any and all of the current Motorsport Australia COVID-19 Ready to Race strategy requirements, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at <u>www.motorsport.org.au</u>. Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. #### SCHEDULE/ OTHER EVENT REQUIREMENTS:

- · Entries will be accepted in order of receipt unless otherwise specified
- The organisers may refuse any entry in accordance with the NCR's of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.
- Entries from competitors under 18 years of age must be counter signed / consented to by a parent/guardian.
- Event organisers reserve the right to cancel, abandon or postpone the event in accordance with the NCR's of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.
- · Protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR's

The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of any drug or other banned substance and subject to a penalty for a breach of the Australian National Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy at <u>www.motorsport.org.au</u>. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any other Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day. The holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy at <u>www.motorsport.org.au</u>.



#### **EVENT REQUIREMENTS:**

#### 1. Event Format

Cars will be divided into groups of Vehicles based on previous lap times recorded at the same circuit in the same vehicle. Group 1 will be for Open Wheel and Clubman Style Vehicles (lightweight with little protection). Where possible, similar types of vehicles will be grouped together in the event where a driver has not competed at the track before. He/she will be placed in the "First Timers" group to determine their appropriate group, or if times are available from another circuit then they may be placed in a group relative to those lap times.

#### ALL VEHICLES will be Grided Fastest to Slowest

Cars may be started in pairs. The maximum number of cars **will be 14 in each group.** Note: This is a speed event, not a race meeting. Cars forming a 'mini-race' anywhere on the circuit or passing dangerously into corners is <u>NOT</u> permitted, and action will be taken by the Clerk of the Course if such an incident takes place.

#### 2. Number of Laps

Each run will comprise a minimum time to allow all competitors to complete at least 3 laps, with the time for the fastest single lap being used for results. The minimum time for each run will be 8 minutes

Proposed minimum number of runs on the day will be 4.

(Note: The Event will not be concluded when this minimum is achieved. Event will only be concluded early for safety reasons or if no competitors are available).

#### 3. Entries.

- a) Maximum number of Drivers per competitor **2** per vehicle. Dual entry of drivers will be at the discretion of the organising club.
- b) Drivers must be a member of the listed Invited Clubs:

- c) General Entry Opening Date: 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2022
- d) Entry Fee: \$195 per driver
- e) Electronic Timing Transponder hire if required **\$15.** Please ensure that the unit is mounted correctly.
- f) Closing Date: 23<sup>rd</sup> of March 2022

A late entry fee of \$20 will apply for entries received after the closing date.

- g) Carport pit garages are on a first come basis. A pit usage fee per garage will be levied by the circuit owners.
- h) Entries will be accepted in order of receipt.



- i) An email confirming acceptance of entries *will be sent to each competitor* (only for entries received more than 5 days before the event.)
- j) If a competitor advises the event secretary that he/she is unable to attend the event, the following procedure regarding a refund applies: More than 5 days prior to the event – full entry fee less \$10 for administration.
- k) Any vehicle presented for scrutineering will for the purpose of the entry be deemed to have competed.

#### 4. Drivers Safety:

Approved helmets and apparel, in accordance with Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

- a) All drivers and passengers shall wear apparel including helmets which comply with AS1698 or better. Helmets must be in good condition with no visual signs of damage.
- b) **Frontal Head Restraints (FHR)** must be used in accordance with Schedule D Table 1.4 of the 2020 Motorsport Australia Manual, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at <u>www.motorsport.org.au</u>; <u>Schedule D Table 1.4 of the 2022 Motorsport Australia Manual</u>.
- c) Non-flammable Clothing must be worn that extends from ankles to neck to wrist. Clothing of flammable synthetic material such as nylon is not acceptable. The onus will be on the competitor to prove that older overalls/suits still have fire-resistant properties and are not impregnated with oil or fuel.
- d) Flame retardant underwear and socks is not mandatory however they are recommended. A Flameretardant balaclava is not mandatory however, a motor sport standard flame retardant balaclava is recommended.
- e) Shoes compliant with FIA8856-2000 or shoes which completely cover the feet, made entirely of leather or other flame-resistant material must be worn. Shoes which have a leather upper but which includes elasticised ankle regions are acceptable. If drivers choose to wear such flammable materials it must be at their own risk.
- f) Gloves are not mandatory, however the use of FIA- standard flame-retardant gloves are strongly recommended.
- g) For a driver of an open car, a full-face helmet is highly recommended. Goggles or a visor with a lens material other than glass (ie to AS1609- 1981) are mandatory as are leather or Nomex gloves which entirely cover the hands.

#### 5. Vehicle Categories & Classes:

As proposed on the attachment located at the bottom of this document marked "2019 CSCA CLASS TABLE".

Note: Rotary and forced induction engines are subject to capacity multipliers as follows: Rotaries – multiply by 1.8 Forced Induction – multiply by 1.7 Forced Induction Rotaries – multiply by 3.06

**Note:** The Organisers may re-classify any vehicle if they believe it is not eligible for the class in which it has been entered.





#### 6. Scrutineering Requirements:

- a) All vehicles are to be presented at scrutineering and must comply with Schedule A and B of the Motorsport Australia Manual and the standard Supersprint Requirements:
  - A fire extinguisher fitted within reach of the driver
  - A blue triangle, 150mm on each side mounted to indicate the battery location.
  - A secondary method of securing the bonnet. **Note:** Road registered cars fitted with the original manufacturers 2 stage bonnet locking system is considered as having two securing systems.
  - All forward facing glass lenses to be completely covered by a protective film.
  - All loose objects are to be removed from the car.
  - The battery is to be firmly clamped.
- b) Competition numbers are to be positioned on both sides of the vehicle, on the door and of a height no less than 28 centimetres and must be clearly legible to the timekeeper and be of a contrasting colour to the surrounding bodywork. Dual entry numbers must be shown to the scrutineer. Self Adhesive Numbers will be available on the day @ \$2.50 each. Windscreen Numbers are preferred at this Venue.
- c) **Drivers and vehicles must be presented in a clean and tidy manner**, completely ready for the track including the driver's apparel and helmet. Any tyre or component changes to the vehicle after scrutineering must be approved by the Chief Scrutineer before the vehicle is taken onto the track.
- d) Any vehicle found to be leaking oil or fluids whilst competing will be suspended from the event until the Chief Scrutineer / Clerk of the Course is satisfied that action has been taken to rectify the leak. Should there be a re- occurrence of the leak then the vehicle will be excluded from the remainder of the event. Clean up of the fluids spilt on the track will be at the driver's expense.
- e) All vehicles must be fitted with visible towing hooks or a similar device both front & rear to allow for the speedy removal of a vehicle from a "sand trap" or removal from the circuit in the case of a mechanical failure.
- f) All video cameras, data loggers & other electronic devices must be securely fixed to the vehicle in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Where suction cups are used a secondary tether sufficiently strong enough to prevent the item moving within the vehicle should the suction cup/s release should be used.

A sticker will be issued confirming that the vehicle has passed scrutineering prior to it being able to compete.

#### 7. Noise:

#### Maximum Noise Limit: 95 dba at 30 metres.

Any car found to exceed the maximum noise emission limit will be suspended from the event until the Chief Scrutineer / Clerk of the Course is satisfied that action has been taken to bring it within the limit. Any vehicle that exceeds the limit on two runs will be excluded from the remainder of the event. If a vehicle exceeds the noise limit on any lap or laps within a run, then only those laps in which the vehicle conformed to the requirements will be allowed for the purpose of the results.

#### 8. Pre-Event Scrutineering:

All competitors must complete the Motorsport Australia vehicle declaration and self-scrutineering check by 25<sup>th</sup> March.

<u>Note:</u> It is the Drivers' responsibility to ensure their vehicles are self-scrutineered. On the day of the event our Chief Scrutineers will be doing spot checks based on submitted vehicle declarations. The driver must attend spot scrutineering personally so that their vehicle can be checked.

Administration will open 7:30am – 9.00am in the Sign On room adjacent to Carport 1. All drivers must sign-in to get their wrist band, scrutineered sticker and licence checks.

<u>Note:</u> The Event will not be delayed due to late arrivals. It is the Drivers' responsibility to ensure their vehicles are scrutineered before the scheduled starting time of the Event. The driver must attend scrutineering personally so that their driving apparel can be checked.



9. Drivers' Briefing: It is compulsory for ALL Drivers to attend. Scrutineering will cease whilst the Drivers' Briefing is in progress.

Time: 9:00 am Location: Control Tower

Note: A Driver sign-on sheet must be completed by all Drivers to prove Briefing attendance, failure to sign on may result in penalties being applied by the Stewards of the Meeting. The Organising Club must retain these sheets for any incident or accident reporting.

- 10. Event Schedule: Start time: 9:30am Finish time: 4:30 pm
- 11. **Replacement Vehicles:** At the sole discretion of the Clerk of the Course, a Driver whose vehicle has broken down may use a replacement vehicle. The replacement vehicle must have been scrutineered, and preferably be in the same class and type as the original vehicle. Where the original vehicle has recorded a time and the scrutineered replacement is not in the same class and type as the original vehicle, the replacement vehicle will not be eligible for prizes and/or trophies.

#### 12. Timing Equipment and Accuracy:

Timing will be **Dorian Timing Units** and to an accuracy of **0.001 seconds**. Those Competitors who don't have a Dorian Timing unit can hire a unit from the organisers for \$15/day. Each Competitor MUST have a Dorian unit. Brackets for affixing to the Vehicle are \$7.50 each and are HIGHLY recommended.

#### 13. Results:

A set of results will be emailed to all competitors within 5 days of the event. Results will be available on the **www.natsoft.com.au** website.

- 14. Prizes / Awards: Trophies will be awarded as per CSCA guide lines.
- 15. Medical Facilities: Ambulance Services Australia. Phone: 1300 762 626
- 16. Crash Rescue and Fire Fighting Facilities: Wally's Motorsport, will be in attendance on site. The principal is Wally Black with 25 years of Fire and Rescue Recovery experience, CAMS Silver Licence 9768926. Mobile Phone No. 0414 750 143. Fire extinguisher equipment will be located at nominated Flag Points on the circuit.
- 17. Refreshment Facilities Available: Provided by Wakefield Park Management.
- 18. Additions and/or Alterations: Any additions and/or alterations to these Supplementary Regulations will be notified to all Drivers in the Final Regulations or during the Drivers' Briefing.
